Lesson 1: Positive and Negative Terms and Ideas

Positive Terms: Terms that do not have a negative word or syllable of denying joined to them.

Negative Terms: Terms that have a little word or syllable of denying joined to them.

Positive Ideas: Pleasant thoughts, etc.

Negative Ideas: Sad, reproachful, etc.

Instructions: In the first blank, mark what type each term is by a + for Positive Term, or - for Negative Term. Then, in the second blank, mark whether the idea of the term is a (+) Positive Idea or a (-) Negative Idea. In the third blank, write what would be an opposite term and idea. In the fourth blank, write what would be an opposite term that means has the same idea. Remember, positive terms can represent negative ideas. You may need to consult a dictionary or thesaurus. The first example is given.
